





Description:

Scottish tradition - interpreted and realised in Styrian style

The barley malt used was smoked during kilning with local peat from the Koralpe, giving it its smoky, spicy flavour. the degree of smoking should not be too extreme and is comparable to that of smoked bacon. After maturing in partly new and partly used American oak barrels, the result is a perfect product. The nose is fruity and malty with only slight smoky notes, which then emerge clearly on the finish and produce a balanced finish.

The whisky was bottled at cask strength after three years of maturation and still impresses with a pleasant, long finish.

Nose:

Malt, harmonious wood notes, non-intrusive smoky flavours

Palate:

soft, fine sweetness from the barrel, phenolic and malty notes, caramel, smoked bacon flavours, long full finish, subtle hints of coffee

Perfect serve: neat at room temperture
